## Safety Matters (Road Safety)

As part of the school's effort in educating pupils on road safety, we would like to seek the cooperation of all parents and guardians, to role model and reiterate the following proper road safety behaviours to your child.

- 1) Use pedestrian crossings, and avoid jaywalking or being distracted with the use of mobile phones or other devices, while crossing the road.
- 2) Practise the kerb drill before crossing "look right, look left, look right again, ensure all vehicles have stopped, raise your hand high up and cross the road briskly".

For students who are cycling/kick boarding to school, do ensure that they know the safe cycling rules and are competent cyclists/kick boarders. Do inform the form teacher so that we can brief your child on road safety and follow up with an official parental acknowledgement form.

## **Cyber Wellness**

Cyber Wellness (CW) refers to the positive well-being of Internet users. We have a CW programme that equips students with the knowledge and skills to harness the power of ICT for positive purposes, maintain a positive presence in cyberspace and be safe and responsible users of ICT. Students should also be a positive peer influence by harnessing technology for collaboration, learning and productivity, as well as advocating positive use of technology for the good of the community.

Parents play an active role in guiding your child to navigate the cyberspace at home, and we seek your support in reinforcing these three key messages with your child:

- 1. Respect self and others Practise asking for consent before posting photos, videos, and details online (including your child's).
- 2. Practise safe and responsible use Show your child how to be safe, responsible and respectful online.
- 3. Be a positive peer influence The values that guide everyday interactions are applicable online.

### **Important Reminders**

**Request of Delivery of Items to Students** Students may borrow money from the General Office if they have forgotten to bring their recess/lunch money. To avoid disrupting lessons, please do not send items such as textbooks, homework and pencil cases. If you need to send other important items, it will only be collected by your child from the General Office during recess.

**Sudden Change of Transport Before Dismissal** There were incidents where parents made last-minute requests for the school to inform their child of a change in transport arrangement. This creates confusion for the children, which may compromise their safety and cause delays to the school's dismissal procedure. Do only change the pick-up routine in case of emergencies and give sufficient time for the school to relay the message.

**Healthy Snack Time** Students enjoy a 5 to 10–minute snack time at 12.10 p.m. daily, except Fridays. The snack should be easy to consume and allows your child to clean up quickly thereafter. Please guide your child in making healthier choices for snack time.

**School Attire** On days without P.E. lessons, students should wear full school uniform. However, in view of mask-wearing, students are allowed to wear half-uniform (P.E. t-shirt with school shorts or skirt) for comfort, on days without P.E. lessons as well. Please note that P1 and P2 pupils should wear full or half uniform for Term 1 PAL lessons, and come to school in full P.E. attire for Terms 2 to 4 PAL lessons.

**Birthday Celebrations** In view of Safe Management Measures, the school has stopped holding birthday celebrations at the canteen. Goody bags are also not allowed due to our students' various dietary needs.

### **Education Programme (GEP) Identification Exercise**

Every year, the school supports the conduct of GEP Identification Exercise as we believe that every child is special. This exercise aims to identify students with high intellectual potential. For 2022, the tentative schedule for the two stages of GEP Identification Exercise is as follows:

GEP Screening Exercise (English Language and Mathematics) will be conducted during curriculum time on 17 August 2022 (Wednesday).

Only shortlisted pupils will be invited to participate in the subsequent Selection Exercise. GEP Selection Exercise (English Language, Mathematics and General Ability) will take place on 18 & 19 October 2022.

The GEP Screening and Selection Exercises will be based on the Primary 1 to Primary 3 English Language and Mathematics syllabuses.

More details of the GEP Screening Exercise and the coverage of topics will be given in Term 3, 2022.

### **Canteen Updates**

### Revised school canteen pricing

Our school works closely with our canteen stallholders to ensure that the food sold is of quality, meets the basic nutritional needs of students and is reasonably priced. As our school canteen stallholders face challenges with rising cost of goods and services, especially with costlier ingredients for healthy meals, it is important that canteen food prices reflect the underlying cost of the food items, while still allowing the stallholders to earn a reasonable profit margin to sustain their businesses.

Based on MOE's engagement with commercial food operators, a sustainable price point at the primary level is \$2.00 per meal to achieve balance between food quality, pricing and business sustainability in the longer term. Therefore, the school has decided, in our regular review of canteen food prices to retain stallholders, to allow our stallholders to raise prices where justifiable. Please refer to the table below for the revised pricing.
