An understanding of how Subject-based Banding works




Why introduce Subject-Based Banding?

Introduced by MOE in 2019

- Every child is unique and has different aptitudes, capabilities and talents.
- ▶ To recognise the different abilities of students
  - Provide more flexibility in subject combinations for students across subjects

What Subject-Based Banding means for your child?

- Greater flexibility in subject combinations
- Your child has the choice to take a combination of standard and foundation subjects, depending on his strengths



# What are the choices available?

[At P4]


How does Subject-Based Banding Work? School recommends subject combination, based on P4 exam results. Parents indicate preferred combination.

[At P5]

Student takes subject combination chosen by parents

[End of P5]

What happens at the end of P5?



Subjectbased Banding and Secondary School admission

- Progression to secondary level depends on the Revised PSLE Scoring System.
  - Different expectations of standard and foundation subjects will be taken into account
- Offering subjects at foundation level is not a disadvantage.
  - Your child will be able to focus on building up strong fundamentals

# Revised PSLE Scoring System: Achievement Levels (ALs)

- ► The PSLE T-Score has been replaced with wider scoring bands, known as Achievement Levels (ALs).
- ► Each PSLE subject will be scored using 8 ALs. Students who perform similarly will be placed in the same AL for each subject.

AL	Raw Mark Range
1	≥ 90
2	85 - 89
3	80 - 84
4	75 - 79
5	65 - 74
6	45 - 64
7	20 - 44
8	< 20

# Revised PSLE Scoring System: Scoring for Foundation Level Subjects

- ► Foundation subject grades are graded in scoring bands from AL A to AL C.
- ► To derive a student's overall PSLE score, AL A to AL C for Foundation level subjects are mapped to AL 6 to AL 8 of Standard level subjects respectively

Grades for Foundation	Foundation Raw Mark Range	Equivalent Standard Level AL
Α	75 - 100	6
В	30 -74	7
С	< 30	8

Exploring the subject combinations available



Achievement and Band Grades for Primary 4

Band 1	85 marks and above	Is very good in the subject
Band 2	70 - 84 marks	Is good in the subject
Band 3	50 - 69 marks	Has adequate grasp of the subject
Band 4	Below 50 marks	Has elementary grasp of the subject

# Selection Criteria

- Based on overall examination score for Primary Four at year-end
- ▶ To take a subject at Standard Level:

Mathematics	50 marks /
Science	Band 3
Mother Tongue

Semestral Assessment Parent to seek input from Subject Teachers










Issuance of SBB Option Form on Admin Day (6 Nov 2023) Parent to respond to SBB Option Form via Parents Gateway (by 9 Nov 2023) Be open and flexible when discussing your child's preferences, needs and choices. Manage your own expectations and do not project these expectations onto your child.

Have regular conversations with your child to understand more about his/her interests and aspirations.



Affirm your child and offer support when he/she shares his/her plans with you.

# Questions posed via Parents Gateway

- 1. Will a child's MT grades be taken into consideration while choosing subjects in SBB?
- 2. Do PR/ Foreign Pass holding students have different standards for SBB?
- 3. Along the way, if the child improves and gets better or could not catch up among the peers in the subject class he/she is in, will there be a review for a change in class?
- 4. Will the students be streamed based on results?
- 5. Will requiring additional support during exams count against a child and increase chances of being placed at a foundational level?
